Additional Information - Request for Special Permit to raise chicken

- 1) We will not be keeping roosters
- 2) We do not plan to keep more than 6-8 chicks or hens at any given time, and will keep only for the purposes of personal use and consumption.
- 3) Feed will be stored in an enclosed rodent-proof container, which is to be locked securely within the coop.
- 4) Chicken waste materials will be limited through use of sand bedding/flooring in the coop and run during all seasons but winter, during which deep litter method of pine shavings will be used. All waste will be handled through the use of compost within proximity to coop/run.
- 5) Chickens will not be free range, and will be contained to coop, run, or within enclosed garden space when under supervision.
- 6) Chicken run design is enclosed on all sides, with a roof and sides dug into ground 12 inches.
- 7) Please see drawing of coop/run location, which is in the rear of the property and more than 15 feet from property line.
